Esplanade - Theatres on the Bay

Located on Marina Bay and close to the estuary of the Singapore River, the Esplanade occupies a 6-hectare site. It is the performing arts centre of Singapore. There is a 1,600-seat concert hall and a 2,000-seat theater that can accommodate performances. The Esplanade Performing Arts Library is located on the 3rd floor of the Esplanade Performing Arts Centre. The Esplanade also includes an outdoor performance venue, and the on-site shopping mall also has retail outlets and restaurants. There is an outdoor open space on the 4th floor of the building.



Merlion Park Merlion can be said to be the representative image of Singapore, and there are a total of 5 officially certified Merlion statues in the whole of Singapore, Merlion Park has this deity and the back miniature version, the other two are located in Singapore Tourism Department and Mount Faber Park, and the highest one is the 9-storey Merlion Tower on Sentosa Island. The story of the half-fish, half-lion Merlion is not just a myth. The Merlion's fishtail body represents Singapore's former fishing village, which was then known as Temasek, and has the same root word for 'tasek' in Malay, which means 'lake'. The Merlion's head represents Singapore's original name, Singapura, which means Lion City in Sanskrit. Legend has it that Sang Nila Utama, the prince of Palembang, Sumatra, was caught in a storm while heading out to sea and made an unexpected landfall in Singapore. At the mouth of the Singapore River, the prince saw a strange creature, which he identified as a lion, so he called Singapore the Lion City.



Brief introduction of the attractions

Science Centre Singapore hosts numerous innovative science exhibitions, showcasing groundbreaking achievements across natural sciences, life sciences, technology, and industry, demonstrating the convenience and enjoyment of science through unique creativity. The centre features thousands of scientific exhibits, with engaging and interactive displays. The centre also boasts an IMAX dome theater, providing an immersive cinematic experience.



Lau Pa Sat is a historic building located within the Downtown Core in the Central Area of Singapore. It was first built in 1824 as a fish market on the waterfront serving the people of early colonial Singapore and rebuilt in 1838. It was then relocated and rebuilt at the present location in 1894. It is currently a food court with stalls selling a variety of local cuisine.



Brief introduction of the attractions

Garden by the Bay is an urban park spanning 105 hectares (260 acres) in the Central Region of Singapore, adjacent to the Marina Reservoir. The park consists of three waterfront gardens: Bay South Garden in Marina South, Bay East Garden with the Founders' Memorial in Marina East and Bay Central Garden in the Downtown Core and Kallang.¹ The largest of the gardens is the Bay South Garden at 54 hectares (130 acres) designed by Grant Associates. Its Flower Dome is the largest glass greenhouse in the world.

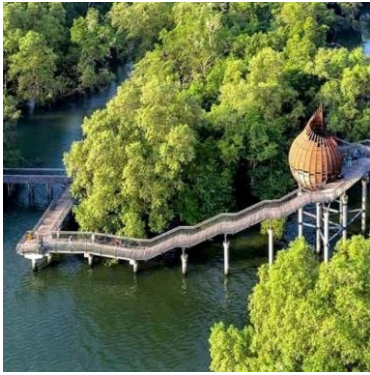


Kampong Glam is located at the northeast of Bugis MRT station, adjacent to Victoria Street, Jln Sultan and Beach Road. It's home to beautiful architecture, exotic shops and delicious food. If you're here during Ramadan, you'll find food stalls and cultural performances all around, especially at night when the festive atmosphere is even more immersive. This laid-back street is full of exquisite shops and little artistic cafes.



Sungei Boloh Nature Park is a nature reserve in the northwest area of Singapore. It is the first wetlands reserve to be gazetted in Singapore (2002), and its global importance as a stop-over point for migratory birds was recognised by the inclusion of the reserve into the East Asian Australasian Shorebird Site Network. The reserve, with an area of 130 hectares, was listed as an ASEAN Heritage Park in 2003.

Among the many birds that can be spotted feeding on the diverse fauna variety of worms and molluscs, are Eurasian whimbrel, common greenshank, common redshank, Mongolia plover, curlew sandpiper, marsh sandpiper and Pacific golden plover, yellow bittern, and cinnamon bittern. Lucky visitors to the reserve may be able to spot the resident family of smooth otters, as well as the rare lesser whistling-duck, and the rare milky stork. The reserve forms part of the Kranji–Mandai Important Bird Area (IBA), identified as such by BirdLife International because it supports Chinese egrets, greater spotted eagles and greater crested terns. Atlas moth, the largest species of moth in Southeast Asia can be found in the back mangrove.



ArtScience Museum The architecture is said to be a form reminiscent of a lotus flower. It was designed by Moshe Safdie and features an exterior made of fibre-reinforce plastic supported internally by a steel lattice.

Referred to as "The Welcoming Hand of Singapore" by Las Vegas Sands chairman Sheldon Adelson, the ArtScience Museum is anchored by a round base in the middle, with ten extensions referred to as "fingers" in the shape of a flower. The design concept for each finger denotes various gallery spaces sporting skylights at the "fingertips", which are included as sustainable illumination for the curved interior walls.



Brief introduction of the attractions

Chinatown It is Singapore's Chinatown which located in Outram District. It is an important Chinese community in the country's history and one of the famous tourist attractions in the country, with a focus on Sino-Portuguese style shophouses. Chinatown is a place full of Chinese culture and history, and it is also an area that is a popular destination for foreign visitors to Singapore. Chinatown is also home to a variety of shops and traditional markets, as well as many classic and authentic Singaporean delicacies, as well as colourful painted walls that tell the story of the area, all of which make Chinatown one of Singapore's most famous tourist districts °



Jewel Changi located in front of Singapore Changi Airport's Terminal 1 and at the heart of the airport, and is designed like a giant doughnut and is inspired by Singapore's "Garden City", with a five-storey "Garden of Stars" with more than 2,000 trees and palms, and more than 100,000 shrubs, with 120 species of trees, ferns and shrubs surrounding the building. The world's tallest indoor waterfall, Rain Vortex, is 40 meters, cascading down from above.
